

Letter from the Program Chair

Dear Colleague:

The annual meeting of the Southeastern Neuroradiological Society will be held October 17-20, 2013 at the Ritz-Carlton in Naples, Florida. This resort was chosen due to its unmatched setting and service. The resort offers a fitness center with full service spa, sauna, steam room, and 24-hour accessible health club. There are complete tennis and golf facilities. In addition to the extensive pool facilities and activities, there are the usual beach activities plus parasailing, wave-runners, and standup paddle boarding. The resort has a diverse set of available children's programs.

Educational sessions at this year's meeting will cover a wide range of topics. A generous amount of time will be allowed for discussion during each day's scientific sessions.



The keynote speaker for this year will be Dr. Kathleen Helton, speaking on "Translational imaging: an opportunity to advance both science and patient care." Pediatric neuroradiology topics will include a review of the phakomatoses and of white matter changes in obese children. Brain topics will include hippocampal changes in seizures, diplopia, traumatic brain injury, and imaging CSF flow. There will be ENT talks on petrous apex lesions and diplopia. Half of Friday's session will be devoted to spine imaging including transverse myelitis, hemangiomas, CT guided procedures and fibrin therapy. Interventional topics will include endovascular therapy for stroke, cavernous malformations, "NANO" technology, and a session devoted to use of flow diversion devices. There will be an ACR update and a report on the current status of the MOC.

The 12th annual "Stump the SENRS Stars" challenge will be presented by Dr. Steve Deprima. Teams of neuroradiologists will once again compete for the coveted *Caput Astrum* award.

This year's meeting will include dinners on both Thursday and Friday evening. And, for the first time, there will also be a talent show on Thursday night. I know that many of our members are highly talented instrumentally and vocally, and we look forward to the competition being an enjoyable part of the evening. Other manifestations of expertise or talent will also be welcome, of course.

This year's meeting is planned to be a great educational experience, with good friends, in a uniquely excellent setting. Please come join us in Naples!

The hotel has three miles of white sand beach, lush tropical gardens and flowering courtyards, Nature's Wonders Center, executive business services, concierge services,






